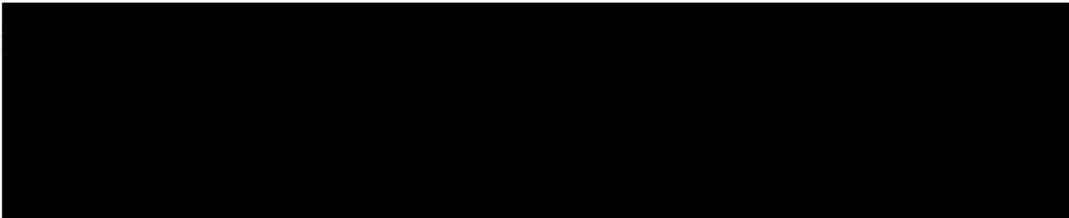

## 5. Statement of Facts

Lisa Graves, Esq authored an article for *Slate* (published on September 6, 2018) wherein she states that Judge Kavanaugh used documents she authored that was stolen from a U.S. Senate (“Senate”) server, and subsequently lied repeatedly under oath that he had not received such information.

The National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (“NAACP”) released a statement on September 8, 2018 asserting that recently released records provide substantial evidence that Judge Kavanaugh made purposefully misleading and false statements to the Senate Judiciary Committee during his appellate confirmation hearings, referencing both the Senate email theft and his role in the nominations of Judges Charles Pickering and William Pryor.

Canon 1 of The Code of Conduct for U.S. Judges and its commentary establish a requisite level of integrity in judges that I strongly believe Judge Kavanaugh has failed to maintain. There is widely circulated evidence of his purposeful and repeated patterns of improper activity with an unquestionably significant effect upon our country and its judicial system.

Canon 2 makes clear that a judge should respect and comply with the law and should act in a manner that promotes confidence in judicial integrity and impartiality. Judge Kavanaugh’s repeated lies under oath and his attempts to cover up direct involvement as an accessory after the fact during a Federal investigation of email theft from the Senate server fly in the face of this canon; his acts demonstrate a lack of honesty, integrity, temperament and fitness to continue serving as a member of the judiciary.

A series of official documents that I believe to be self-authenticating have been made public and are the basis of my allegations against Judge Kavanaugh. I am confident of the existence of additional confidential documents in White House, Department of Justice (“DOJ”) and Senate archives that reflect long-standing patterns of dishonesty, disrespect for the authority of the Senate and its rules and attempts to prevent the DOJ from ascertaining all information germane to the Senate email theft.

Judge Brett Kavanaugh has brought disrepute, distrust and dishonor to the judiciary by his hidden involvement in the use of stolen data, lying about said involvement under oath, failing to reveal the source of his recent \$200,000 debt repayment, and lying under oath regarding his involvement in the appointments of Judges Pickering and Pryor.
