Hon. Judge Tymkovich,

While my complaint is not in response to statements made by Judge Kavanaugh as a nominee to the Supreme Court of the US, they do relate to comments publicly reported in a speech to law school undergraduates in 2015.

I feel compelled to inform the court why the comments should have been considered as part of his nomination process and that an error was made by either ignoring or failing to consider their implication.

Speaking to the Columbus School of Law in 2015 Judge Kavanaugh said "What happens at Georgetown Prep stays at Georgetown Prep". These are highly prejudicial remarks that indicate judge Kavanaugh believes a cover-up of the truth is appropriate when reputations of he and his classmates may be at stake.


No specific allegations of wrong-doing at that time were made. The relevance of Judge's Kavanaugh's view on when it is appropriate to conceal the truth has only recently come to light.

These remarks indicate to me Judge Kavanaugh lacks even a basic understanding that determining the truth is essential to justice and that withholding the truth, other than self-incrimination, during any proceeding is an abhorrent principal to the The Supreme Court. It obviously can lead to miscarriage of justice and in no circumstance should be tolerated, let alone voiced by a nominee for the Supreme Court.

To utter these remarks publicly should have led to censor or dismissal in 2015. They were not considered important enough – if considered at all – in the nomination process.

In view of these remarks being made in public to law school undergraduates – future lawyers, prosecutors and judges - now is the time to reconsider his qualifications for Associate Supreme Court Justice, and even his position on the Appeals Court.
