

Dear Professor Cooper:

At the Annual Spring Meeting, The Maritime Law Association of the United States, held on Friday, May 5, 2001, the following resolution was unanimously adopted by the Members of the Association

RESOLVED that The Maritime Law Association of the United States supports an amendment to Rule B to clarify and define the time for determination of when the defendant is "not found within the district" to be at the time of the filing of the complaint and affidavit required by Rule B(1); and

FURTHER RESOLVED that The Maritime Law Association of the United States encourages the Advisory Committee to include a comment cautioning practitioners about the necessity of filing the complaint and affidavit together in order to obtain Rule B process.

On behalf of The Maritime Law Association, I ask that you report this resolution to the Advisory Committee in connection with its review of suggested changes to Rule B of the
