To the Advisory Committee on Bankruptcy Rules:

Current Rule 2002(m) of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure authorizes the court to “enter orders:”

(m) ORDERS DESIGNATING MATTER OF NOTICES. The court may from time to time enter orders designating the matters in respect to which, the entity to whom, and the form and manner in which notices shall be sent except as otherwise provided by these rules.

Under Rule 5003(a), the clerk is supposed to enter orders. The court “orders” or “issues orders;” the clerk enters them on the docket. Might I suggest an amendment to Rule 2002(m)?
