RE: Small Claims Procedure in Bankruptcy

Dear Mr. McCabe:

This is to request that the Advisory Committee on Bankruptcy Rules consider the possibility of a small claims procedure for certain adversary proceedings.

This procedure might be useful for many consumer discharge-ability claims. As with traditional small claims procedures, the process would be less formal, and corporations would not be required to hire attorneys in order to obtain a day in court. Similarly, debtors would not be dealing with a war of attrition waged by house counsel. Discovery would be eliminated. The trial would be conducted in an informal manner.

I suggest that the existence of such a procedure would enable parties to obtain their day in court swiftly and economically.
