**PROCUREMENT** 

These updates incorporate a threshold increase that takes effect July 12, 2021. As shown in the Redline Comparison below, the fair opportunity threshold for other federal agency contracts (OFACs) such as NASA SEWP will increase from \$3,500 to \$10,000.

(c) When ordering from OFACs under any of the above scenarios, the judiciary is required to follow the contract's ordering procedures, competition threshold and the other federal agency contract's terms and conditions. For example, NASA SEWP's procedures for providing for fair opportunity requires that all contractors be given an opportunity to provide a quote for all requirements that exceed \$3,50010,000.

- (b) Orders against a multiple award IDIQ contract (e.g., NASA SEWP), with an estimated price not exceeding the fair opportunity threshold of \$3,50010,000, need not provide fair opportunity or be advertised. However, COs are encouraged to rotate such orders among holders of multiple award IDIQ contracts.
- (c) Orders against multiple award IDIQ contracts, with an estimated price exceeding the fair opportunity threshold of \$3,50010,000 are subject to fair opportunity as identified in the base contract. The CO must provide each awardee a fair opportunity to be considered for each order that exceeds the threshold.
