- Clause 7-205, to add the Juneteenth National Independence Day to the holiday list.

Appendices 1D, 1E, and 1F updates clarify required training courses for Contracting Officer Certification Program (COCP) Levels 1, 2 and 3.

Guide Transmittal 14-020 - Procurement

Chapter 3 changes replace DUNS with UEI and update references to AbilityOne and the General Services Administration's (GSA) System for Award Management (SAM).

The significant changes are detailed in the Redline Comparison below.

Clause 3-300, Registration in the System for Award Management (SAM)

Include the following clause as prescribed in § 330.10.30(dd)(1) (Provisions and Clauses).

Registration in the System for Award Management (SAM) (APR 2013OCT 2023)

(a) Definitions. As used in this clause –

[. . .]

"Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS) number" Unique entity identifier (UEI) means the 9-digit number assigned by Dun and Bradstreet, Inc. (D&B) number or other identifier used to identify unique business entities.

"Data Universal Numbering System +4 (DUNS+4) number" means the DUNS number assigned by D&B plus a 4-character suffix that may be assigned by a business concern. (D&B has no affiliation with this 4-character suffix.) This 4-character suffix may be assigned at the discretion of the business concern to establish additional SAM records specific commercial, nonprofit, or Government entity. See www.sam.gov for identifying alternative Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) accounts the designated entity for the same concernestablishing UEI.

Clause 3-300 [cont'd]

"Registered in the SAM database" means that -

(1) The contractor has entered all mandatory information, including the DUNS number or the DUNS+4 numberUEI, into the SAM database; and

- (b) [...]
 - The offeror shall enter, in the block with its name and address on the cover page of its offer, the annotation "DUNS" or "DUNS +4Unique Entity Identifier" followed by the DUNS or DUNS +4 number UEI that identifies the offeror's name and address exactly as stated in the offer. The DUNS number UEI will be used by the contracting officer to verify that the offeror is registered in the SAM database.
- (c) If the offeror does not have a <u>DUNS numberUEI</u>, it <u>may obtain one at SAM.gov. The offeror should contact Dun and Bradstreet directly be prepared</u> to <u>obtain one.provide the following information:</u>
 - (1) An offeror may obtain a DUNS number
 - (i) via the internet at http://fedgov.dnb.com/webform or if the offeror does not have internet access, it may call Dun and Bradstreet at 1-866-705-5711 if located within the United States; or
 - (ii) if located outside the United States, by contacting the local Dun and Bradstreet office. The offeror should indicate that it is an offeror for a U.S. Government contract when contacting the local Dun and Bradstreet office.
 - (2) The offeror should be prepared to provide the following information:
 - (i) company legal business name;
 - (#2) tradestyle, doing business, or other name by which your entity is commonly recognized;
 - (iii3) company physical street address, city, state and ZIP code;
 - (iv4) company mailing address, city, state and ZIP code (if different from physical);
 - (<u>v5</u>) company telephone number;
 - (vi6) date the company was started;
 - (vii7) number of employees at your location;
 - (viii8) chief executive officer/key manager;
 - (ix9) line of business (industry);
 - (x10) company headquarters name and address (reporting relationship within your entity).

Clause 7-205, Payment for Judiciary Holidays

Payment for Judiciary Holidays (APR 2013 OCT 2023)

On judiciary holidays, on-site contractors are not entitled to compensation unless:

(3) the contractor obtains <u>written</u> approval from the contracting officer or designated contracting officer's representative (COR) to perform work at an off-site location. The following holidays are observed by the judiciary: [. . .] <u>Juneteenth National Independence Day, [. . .].</u>

[Significant changes in Appendix 1D (Contracting Officers' Certification Program – Level 1 Purchase Card Program) follow:]

Training Required for Level 1 Certification – <u>Judiciary Purchase Card Program Training (online training – Blackboard CourtsLearn Course 2)</u>. Ttraining must be reviewed; completed every two years.

[Significant changes in Appendix 1E (Contracting Officers' Certification Program – Level 2 Special Program Delegation) follow:]

Training Required for Level 2 Certification – <u>Small Purchase Procedures</u>, <u>Standard Competitive Contracting Procedures</u>, <u>Special Categories of Procurements Judiciary Basic Procurement Seminar (Course 3)</u>, and <u>Appropriations Law for the U.S. Courts (Course 4)</u> (both available online), plus any specialized training programs offered by the responsible AO program office. **See:** <u>Guide, Vol. 14, § 120.40.15 (AO Office with Primary Program Responsibility)</u>.

[Significant changes in Appendix 1F (Contracting Officers' Certification Program – Level 3) follow:]

Training Required for Level 3 Certification – Judiciary Procurement Workshop (classroom training), plus <u>Judiciary Basic Procurement Seminar-Small Purchase Procedures, Standard Competitive Contracting Procedures, and Appropriations Law for the U.S. Courts (both available online).</u> Level 3 COs must also complete a minimum of 16 hours of <u>continuing education</u> every two years.

Before making a determination of responsibility, the CO must possess or obtain information sufficient to be satisfied that the prospective contractor currently meets applicable standards of responsibility.

(a) At a minimum, for open market and sole source awards, the CO must check GSA's SAM.gov exclusions pageSystem for Award Management (SAM). [...]

Any judiciary recommendation for debarment must be submitted to the PE for action according to § 320.50 (Procedural Requirements for Debarment) or § 320.60 (Causes for Suspension). After a debarment or suspension determination is made, the PE will furnish GSA notice of the determination made by the judiciary for inclusion on the EPLS. Exclusions – System for Award Management (SAM). The PE will:

(a) provide GSA with the information required by § 320.30.15 (Excluded Parties SystemExclusions – System for Award Management (SAM)) after the action becomes effective;

- (a) Most prevailing wage determinations may be obtained using the DOL's Wage Determinations OnLine link at beta.SAM.gov. [. . .]
- (b) [. . .] To complete the <u>e98</u>, the CO may need to review the DOL publication, Service Contract Act Directory of Occupations, found on <u>beta.SAM.govSAM.gov</u> Wage Determination Learning Center to determine the appropriate classes of service employees needed to perform the work.

- (d) The CO must anticipate the amount of time required to gather the information necessary to obtain a wage determination, including sufficient time, if necessary, to contact DOL to request wage determinations that are not available using beta.SAM.govSAM.gov.
- (e) Although the <u>beta.SAM.govSAM.gov</u> website provides assistance to select the correct wage determination, the CO is responsible for the wage determination selected. [. . .]
- (f) To obtain the applicable wage determination for each contract action, the CO must determine the following information concerning the service employees expected to be employed in performing the contract:
 - (1) the classes of service employees to be employed in performance of the contract using the Service Contract Act Directory of Occupations, found on beta.SAM.govSAM.gov; [. . .]

§ 332.40.10 Impact of a Revised Wage Determination

(a) [...]

(1) If the original wage determination was obtained using the wage determination at beta.SAM.gov, the time of receipt is deemed as the first day of publication of the revised determination on the website.

(c) Whether or not the CO must incorporate a revised wage determination depends on when the revision is published on beta.SAM.govSAM.gov and when contract performance is required to start.
