Since 1995, fluctuations have occurred in prisoner petitions as a result of legislation (the Prison Litigation Reform Act and Title 1 of the Antiterrorism and Effective Death Penalty Act, both of which were passed in April 1996) and the Supreme Court decisions *Bailey v. United State* 16 U.S. 13; (1995), and *Apprendi v. New Jersey*, 530 U.S. 466 (2000).
